

SPRINGING IN TO THE SPAWN

Spring is the time of promises not just of the summer to come, but of the certainty of spawners in our Sierra streams. Two of my favorite streams for the pursuit of these spring trout runs are the Owen's River and McGee Creek above their terminus with Crowley Lake.

Now that we have a very healthy cutthroat population in Crowley we are experiencing plentiful numbers of these fish in both streams during the spawn. Our cadre of fly fishers have landed fish over 5 lbs. with regularity when we have been lucky enough to intercept them on the rivers.

Fishing for spawners is usually the best chance for the average fly fisher to catch a trophy all year (or in their lifetime), however with those opportunities comes responsibility. It is generally accepted that you do not cast to actively spawning fish, that is, the ones on the redds (also known as spawning beds). Redds can be easily spotted by the bright gravel that make them up and the trout become very vulnerable when they are over the redds because they show up against this shiny background much more easily.

So go ahead and cast in to the banks where fish may be holding (and avoid wading on the redds), but stay away from the actively spawning fish. Remember, they are creating the next generation of lunkers for us to catch.

Tight lines and fighting fish to all!

OWENS RIVER FLOAT BISHOP, CALIFORNIA

A few months ago, my friend of over 50 years, Bob Allaire, began talking about taking a guided float on the Lower Owens River. We had tried in my drift boat several years ago, but our timing was bad; High Water !!! We floated alright, but there was no fishing in the chocolate colored water. Since that trip I did float the river again with Gary Scott and we did catch a few fish, but Bob wanted to go with someone who know what he was doing. Which is what I should have done before trying it myself. Oh well, live and learn.

Pat Jaeger of Eastern Sierra Guide Service offers full day float trips for \$450. That includes all tackle you would need, flies, etc. But once again, the big concerns were weather

and water flow. Two months ahead Bob picked March 20 and all we could do was hope conditions would be right. If conditions are not fishable, Pat will allow customers to reschedule without charge.

As it turned out, the time for the trip was when the Big Pineapple Express Storm was coming in to Southern California, with predictions of heavy rain. Luck held, and the rain didn't start in the Owens Valley until Wednesday. The weather was unbelievably good, relatively warm, high near 60, and little wind. And, the flows in the river were almost perfect. Now, if only the fish would cooperate.

Pat told us to meet him at the bridge over the Owens River along Hwy 6 at 8:30, so it would be civilized fishing, not having to get up with the sun. After a night in a local motel we had a great breakfast at The Petite Pantry, north of the fair grounds. While the restaurant was petite, the meals were not. Next time you're in Bishop give it a try.

> Pat had the boat launched when we pulled up next to his truck. Then the shuttle; following him to the takeout point and back to the boat to start. He had rods ready; one for nymphs and another for streamers with a sinking line. And, he had a couple "Tenkara" fly rods; the ones that are like an ol' cane poles with the string tied to the end.

> If you are not familiar with this type of rod, it was developed in Japan and is a telescoping rod that extends from about 18" to 12 feet! The line is looped to the end and is usually about the length of the rod. A leader is attached and then your fly. We used them for nymphing, but they can be used with dry flies.

I had my Sage 9' 5 wt. with a floating line for fishing dries. Pat kept hoping for some caddis to come off, but they failed to show up. Perhaps the drop in atmospheric pressure with the approaching storm discouraged the bugs. A few small Mayflies popped up occasionally and fish would rise to them, but not what you would call a hatch. Pat had me stay with a size 16 Parachute Caddis and it acted at an attractor. He encouraged me to "skitter" or drag the fly across the surface to simulate a caddis laying eggs. However, most fish hit the free-floating fly. A few times, as I pulled the fly back to recast, and it went under, a fish would hit at it, but no hook-ups.

The trip was a real learning session as Pat demonstrated various techniques, especially with

a small streamer. He used a size 10 or 12 Hornberg. This is a very old fly pattern, developed by Frank Hornberg in Wisconsin in the 1920's. There are many variations and the one we used was a simpler tie without the Jungle Cock 'eyes". Pat's technique was from the front of the drift boat to do a short cast with sinking line into the current and let the fly dead-drift down stream, feeding line while keeping your hand on the line in case a fish struck. Then stick the front two feet of the rod into the water to get the fly down and move the rod across the current to swing the fly through the water. Then strip the fly back. When done properly, keeping the fly down in the current, this was quite successful. Some strikes were quite



hard and we though the fish were much bigger than they turned out to be.

A new way of fly fishing neither of us had attempted is with a "Tenkara" rod. And again, it was "school time". Pat positioned the strike indicator above the nymph, with a split shot about 18" above the fly. If we did not get a strike after a few casts he would adjust the indicator up or down so the fly would be at the right depth. The technique for casting was a "lob" cast; get the fly and line down-stream, look up stream to where you want to cast, bring the rod to your "down stream ear" and flip the rod, line, and fly to your target. Then do the "Leishurling Lift" to get most of the line off the water as the indicator floated toward you, as it passes dip the rod down to give more line to continue the drift. We were using bead-head Caddis patterns and caught fish when we would do it right.



We caught a mix of Browns and Rainbows, the biggest a pretty Brown about 14". We kept hoping for a Big One, but it was not to be. The color variation of the Browns was amazing; some quite light and silvery with yellow fins and other the darker brown of a Brown Trout. (photos above).

Wednesday was light on-and-off rain showers and we went for a drive. Up Sherwin Grade, past Crowley and the turn off to Mammoth. I wanted to drive by what had been Alper's Owens River Ranch. Years ago, a guy from the East bought the Arcularious Ranch which was just below Alper's. Then when Tim Alper's sister wanted out of the guest ranch business it went up for sale and the same guy bought it. Two wonderful old fishing quest ranches gone to private hands. A few years ago, a fire swept through the area, destroying several of the old cabins. A lot of memories flooded our minds. Now the only quest ranch is Hot Creek Ranch.





We drove down Owens River Road to Hot Creek. In the light on-and-off sprinkles I decided to hike down the gorge and give it a try. Something I had never seen before, there were no cars in any of the parking lots!

I got down to the "Sign Pool" and tied on a small Copper John and was surprised that nothing hit. And even more surprised that there were no other fishermen. As I worked up stream I changed to a size 18 Bead Head Pheasant Tail type nymph and fish started taking it.

Or, was it that I was getting better at doing a short hook set when the nymph paused for a split second? As I got further up stream I must have been doing something right because I kept hooking fish. All small, nothing over 10-11 inches. Both Browns and Rainbows.

After an hour and a half and a bunch of fish I called it a day.

A day without another angler on the stream!
