DON WAS MY FRIEND HONUS WAS MY FISHING BUDDY

DON HONUS
1942– May 6, 2018

FIRST, I WANT TO SET THE RECORD STRAIGHT.....HONUS WAS NOT CHEAP....HE WAS THRIFTY!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!! After ordering 35 years at Taco Bell, 2-tostadas and a glass of water for \$1.70 is NOT cheap, but thrifty.

Kathleen and I moved to the Westlake Island in 1976. One night while out fishing I started a conversation with a gentlemen fishing off his dock. That was Don Honus and the beginning of 40 years of adventures that took us to Alaska, Canada, Idaho, Wyoming, and the most special trips to Montana. Wherever we went Don would stop and talk to anyone and everyone to find out "where are you fishing?" "what are you using?"he was a master at sponging out all the needed info.....one of his nick names became "**THE SPONGE**".

Don was very proud of his firemen service and wherever we went he loved to tell his firemen stories. I heard them so often that some of them I could tell better than he could. We had many experiences with bears, moose, buffalo, rattlesnakes, leaking tents, leaking boats, leaking waders, etc. Of the many stories the one that still brings a smile to my face occurred on one of the Montana trips.

After finishing our fishing late into the evening at Dupuys Spring Creek outside Livingston, we made a mad dash in the RV to beat the 10:00 closing of "Taco Johns" to get the \$2.80 special of two enchiladas, rice and beans and a glass of water. That's thrifty ...not cheap!!!! While flying through town we were stopped for speeding. Honus was always working the firemen thing, so when the officer was collecting my info Honus leaned over and said, "would it help if I was a firemen?" At that point the officer leaned in and said, "only if you've got a fire in there". It was a double hit. We got a \$100 fine AND we missed Taco Johns. Honus paid half.

Over the years we caught 1000s of trout and never kept one, although we kept track of the size and numbers, we never competed. In the early years we always carried guns with us. On one trip while in Slough Creek of Yellowstone we were confronted by a bear that started walking towards us. At about 40 yards Honus pulled out his two bullet 22 long rifle pocket pistol. Thankfully, the bear turned away at which time we looked at each other and started laughing. That was the last year we carried guns. I never did find out if that gun was for the bear or for me??????

We all have special friends that we share life's experiences and adventures, Don was that friend to me. I will miss him dearly, but will always have memories of some of the best times of my life. Ill miss you bud.

How many years ago did I meet Don Honus at a Conejo Valley Fly Fishers meeting? ? Maybe thirty or more? ? Wow, time flies when your having fun, and many others and I had lots of fun being with and fishing with Don.

When it came to most things Don was fastidious. His equipment was in top shape and the flies he tied were beautiful and functional. He worked at proper presentation in both fly fishing and everything else.

Several times Don and Bob Kieling, with two others, rented a motorhome in Bozeman and fish their way up the Yellowstone River into Yellowstone National Park and then west to the Madison River. Most years we would meet to fish from the private property by the famous "Log Jam". Don, Bob, and others would wade behind the log jam for the evening caddis hatch, fishing until they could not see their fly, but set the hook when they heard a splash or rise. Great times were had by all.

As a "reward" for taking them to this "little bit of heaven", they would treat me to drinks and dinner in the motor home. As Bob Kieling mentioned, Don was "Thrifty". Yes, he would pay \$100 or \$150 to fish Armstrong's Spring Creek, but when it came to fishing the Log Jam on the Madison he would spring for a "grommet" dinner - Pasta and Ragu Sauce! No meat or sausage in the sauce, just plain Ragu from the jar. Wow, I felt special!



But it was worth it. Don was that kind of friend. Watching him enjoy himself while fishing was my pay-back. Many times, I wish I had spent more time and fished more often with him.

Don, you will always be in our thoughts and sincerely missed.

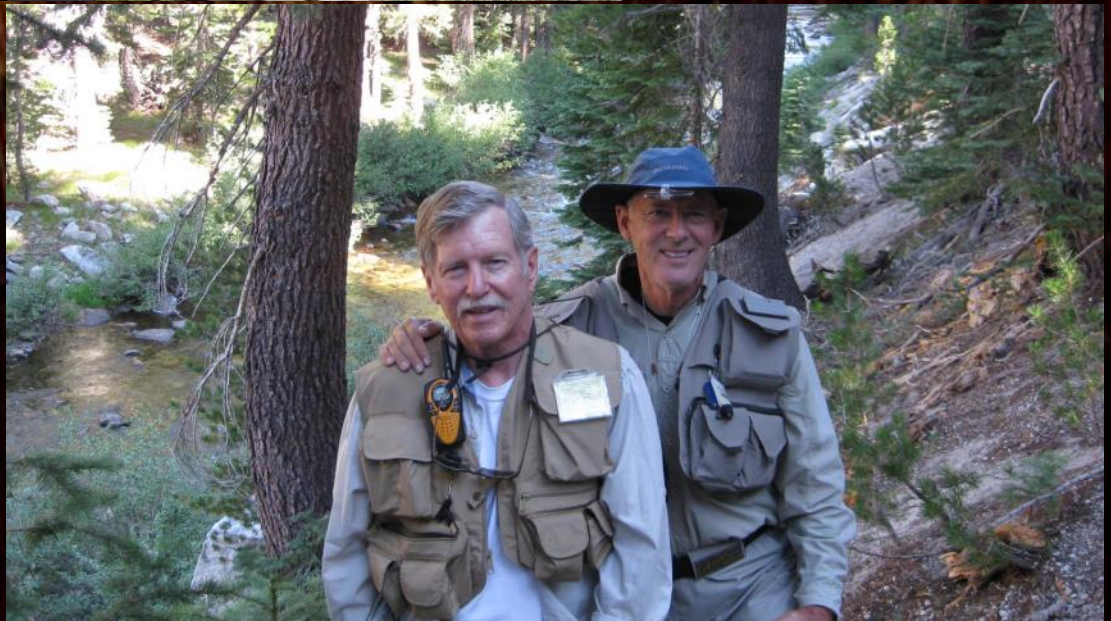

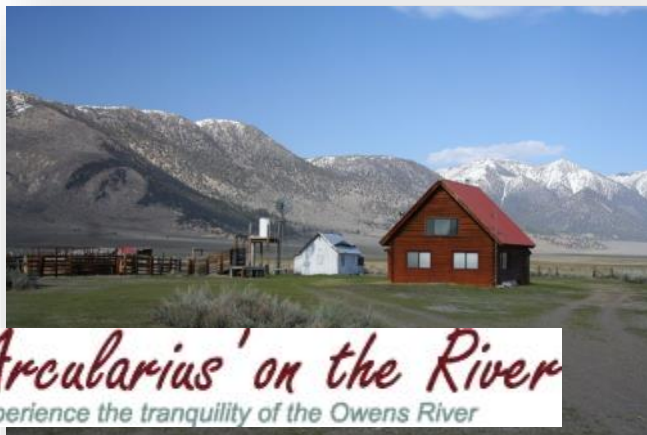
