

The memories shared and made? Is this not a worthy cause to promote the efforts of passing on the passion and education of flyfishing for our club?



Please come to learn more about how to enjoy our local beach playground and the Corbina Patrol...interested...












## CONSERVATION | GOOD NEWS!

With a great deal of pride and a sigh of relief I send this link which covers the news that the license to operate the 4 dams on the Klamath River – Iron Gate, Copco 1, Copco 2, and J.C. Boyle – has been transferred from Pacific Power to the Klamath River Renewal Corp, and sets in motion the final efforts for removal. This is great news for salmon, for our fly fishing community of the future, and for all the stakeholders along the river. Read more > click here

This will be the largest dam removal & watershed restoration project in U.S. history and finally will allow a free-flowing river for anadromous fish to the upper watersheds in Oregon. The remaining barriers (2) have good fish passage, and Oregon has been preparing for the return of both salmon & steelhead.

This is a momentous moment that marks generations of efforts by a large community, including NCCFFI. It's been close to 20 years of effort, congressional outreach, Tribal and NGO communications, and thousands of hours of meetings, phone calls & zoom calls. I'm proud to say our fishing community here in California (NCCFFI, TU & Cal Trout) has been a driving force for all these years.

With this transfer comes the final efforts to qualify for license surrender under FERC, and removal. Pre-removal construction will start in mid-2022, and removal starts in January 2023. All 4 dams will be removed by October 2023 and restoration of the watershed will begin. Thanks to FFI, our clubs, and NCCFFFI leadership which have all supported our involvement. My hope is that the dams on the lower Snake River are next!






