

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where is the Inyo National Forest in Mono County? Inyo National Forest land in Mono County stretches from the southern end of the County to roughly Lundy Lake and Conway Summit, just north of Lee Vining. Areas include Rock Creek, McGee Creek, Convict Lake, Mammoth Lakes, June Lake, Mono Lake, Tioga Pass, Lee Vining, and Lundy Lake. See a map here.

Where is the Bridgeport Ranger District of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest in Mono County?

The Bridgeport Ranger District begins at about Conway Summit and stretches north to Topaz and the Nevada State Line. Areas include Virginia Lakes, Green Creek, Twin Lakes (Bridgeport), Sonora Pass, Walker River canyon, Walker, Coleville, and Topaz. See a map <u>here</u>.

CALIFORNIA STATEWIDE FIRE SUMMARY AUGUST 29, 2021

Today, nearly 16,000 firefighters remain on the frontlines of 15 major wildfires and two extended attack wildfires burning across California. Yesterday, crews continued their progress towards containment. Although 38 new initial attack wildfires were sparked yesterday, crews were able to contain most of them quickly though two, the Chaparral Fire and Roadside Fire, have grown to large wildfires.

Since the beginning of the year, wildfires have burned more than 1.7 million acres in California. While firefighters continue their battle on the current major wildfires, CAL FIRE and fire departments across the State remain prepared for potential more significant wildfires due to critical fire weather. | <u>READ THE WHOLE REPORT</u>

Waters on BLM land, City of Los Angeles land, and private land continue to be open. Waters open would include Owens River, Crowley Lake, Bishop Creek in the Owens Valley, and Bishop Creek Canal.

THIS IS NOT A COMPLETE LIST OF WATERS NOT EFFECTED BY THE FOREST SERVICE CLOSURE.

- Lower Owens River Wild Trout Section: Open to fishing. No restrictions.
- Hot Creek / Interpretive Site: Closed to fishing per Inyo National Forest closure.
- Hot Creek Ranch: Open to fishing. No restrictions.
- Hot Creek Canyon Section: Closed to fishing per Inyo National Forest closure.
- Upper Owens River / Big Springs: Closed to fishing per Inyo National Forest closure.
- Upper Owens River / Above and Below Benton Crossing Bridge: Open to fishing. No restrictions.
- Bishop Creek Canal Behind the Ford Dealer: Open to fishing. No restrictions.
- San Joaquin River: Closed to fishing per Inyo National Forest closure.







Dear Administrator Regan:

One year ago, President Biden promised to protect Bristol Bay, Alaska from the destructive Pebble Mine. On behalf of the undersigned organizations, representing tens of millions of members across the country, we write with a simple request: honor that promise and take immediate action under Section 404(c) of the Clean W ater Act to protect Bristol Bay and stop the Pebble Mine. Our request echoes and supports the requests made to you on July 27, 2021 by United Tribes of Bristol Bay and on August 3, 2021 by Bristol Bay Native Association, Bristol Bay Native Corporation, and Bristol Bay Economic Development Corporation.

You have pledged to lead the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in a way that places climate change, clean water, environmental justice, Tribal sovereignty, and science at the center of its decision-making process.

Protecting Bristol Bay's clean water and wild salmon from the existential threat posed by the Pebble Mine perfectly aligns with those objectives. Bristol Bay is home to the world's greatest wild salmon fishery, generating \$2.2 billion annually, supporting 15,000 jobs, providing 57 percent of the world's sockeye salmon, and sustaining indigenous communities. <u>COMPLETE LETTER AS A PDF</u>

EMERGENCY FISHING CLOSURES IN DESCHUTES, Other Mid-Columbia tributaries begin September 1st due to low steelhead returns.



SALEM, Ore.—In response to extremely low returns to date of Columbia Basin upriver summer steelhead, ODFW is adopting additional emergency rules to increase protections for wild summer steelhead in certain Oregon Columbia River tributaries. Effective Sept. 1 the following emergency regulations are in place:

DESCHUTES RIVER

- From markers at lower end of Moody Rapids upstream to Sherars Falls, closed to angling for steelhead from Sept. 1-30.
- From markers at lower end of Moody Rapids downstream to the mouth at Interstate 84 Bridge closed to angling (all species) from Sept. 1-30.
 - Managers will monitor the return and consider whether the fishery can reopen in October or whether further restrictions are needed.

UMATILLA RIVER

From Hwy 730 Bridge upstream to Threemile Dam, closed to retention of steelhead Sept. 1-Dec. 31.

JOHN DAY RIVÊR

Upstream of Tumwater Falls, closed to angling for steelhead from Sept. 1-Dec. 31.

WALLA WALLA RIVER

Upstream of the Oregon/Washington state line, closed to retention of steelhead Sept. 1-Dec. 31.

Hot Creek Canyon Section: Closed to fishing per Inyo National Forest closure.
Upper Owens River / Big Springs: Closed to fishing per Inyo National Forest closure.
Upper Owens River / Above and Below Benton Crossing Bridge: Open to fishing.

No restrictions.

Bishop Creek Canal Behind the Ford Dealer: Open to fishing. No restrictions. **San Joaquin River:** Closed to fishing per Inyo National Forest closure.

HOW THE COURTS ARE KEEPING SALMON ALIVE

SALMON & STEELHEAD RUNS | PARTNER EARTHJUSTICE

With endangered salmon and steelhead in the Columbia and Snake rivers staring down the barrel of extinction, Earthjustice went to court in July 2021 on behalf of 11 fishing and conservation groups seeking an order to afford these fish a better chance of survival.

Salmon and steelhead must navigate a series of eight dams as they travel from the cold, mountain streams of their birth out to the Pacific Ocean, and then back again -16 dam passages in total over the perilous journey that can be as long as 1,600 miles round-trip. Fish used to make this journey in one direction over a period of days. Now, impeded by the dams and the stagnant reservoirs they create, it takes weeks - if they make it at all - exposing the fish to heat, predators, and disease, not to mention the risks associated with just getting past each dam. | <u>READ MORE</u>

HOW TO GET INVOLVED


