

Michael Schweit has been a licensed contractor for over 30 years. Skills from that business translate into organizational skills and juggling many balls in the air. He started flyfishing in 1982 and served as Outings Chair for Sierra Pacific Fly Fishers from 1999-2006. As Southwest Council President from 2009-2019 he worked with the BOD to create the Fly Fishing Faire, Riptide Rendezvous, Club Management Day and Fly Buy.

He fishes the salt primarily (with a world record white seabass on the fly) but is not averse to fishing anywhere species with gills and/or scales are found. Currently as Special Projects Director he organizes events such as tournaments, outreach and assists in Council fundraising functions.

Michael Schweit is a chartermaster out of Channel Islands Sportfishing. 

# BY ANDREW SHEELER UPDATED OCTOBER 08, 2021 1:20 PM

California will now issue 365-day fishing licenses, under a new law signed by Gov. Gavin Newsom. Previously, the state issued a calendar-based license that expired on Dec. 31, regardless of when it was issued.

Assembly Bill 817, authored by Assemblyman Jim Wood, D-Santa Rosa, also authorizes the California Department of Fish and Wildlife to allow for sport fishing licenses to be displayed electronically on a mobile device

The new law seeks to reverse a trend that has found California annual resident sport fishing license sales down 55% since 1980, despite the state's population growth by 60% in that same period, according to Wood's office.




Update on Kore Gold Mining Operation Near Hot Creek | REPORT FROM AQUABONITA FLY FISHING CLUB

# CAPITOL CORNER: BUDGET FUNDING FOR FISH, WATER, & PEOPLE

The California Legislature released the final budget language late on the Sunday of Labor Day weekend. CalTrout remains critical of the unnecessary delay in releasing critical budget items like emergency drought funding, wildfire relief, and climate resilience packages. As water curtailment orders go live throughout the state, the legislature is still waiting to officially approve these critical funding packages to combat the effects of climate during this year's especially dry drought conditions.

Despite these real and unavoidable consequences of a slow legislative process, CalTrout remains optimistic as state government is poised to inject over \$8.8 billion in drought preparedness, climate resilience, and fire preparedness funding. This large injection of natural resource funding was made possible by the fact that California oversaw a \$50 billion surplus and successful advocacy from strong promoters, including the individuals on CalTrout's own policy team, in directing a large portion of these funds towards protecting our natural water resources. | READ MORE







### 30 YEARS LATER: UPPER SAC RIVER AND CANTARA LOOP SPILL

The Upper Sacramento River was again at risk of devastation after a Union Pacific train derailed recently at Cantara Loop, reminding many of the disastrous spill over 30 years ago in the same location. Luckily this time, no spills of any kind occurred, but this further strengthens the argument that this pristine stretch of river requires protection.

### **DISASTROUS SPILL**

In July 1991, a 97-car Southern Pacific train derailed at the Cantara Loop near Mt. Shasta and dumped 19,000 gallons of herbicide metam sodium into the Sacramento River. Within two days, the spill had reached Shasta Lake, leaving in its wake hundreds of thousands of dead fish and 45 miles of river so scoured of life that not even algae remained.

Later that summer, it appeared that the California Department of Fish and Game would comply with demands from the town of Dunsmuir to open the river to anglers and plant massive amounts of hatchery fish into the river. Southern Pacific also supported this short-sighted proposal.

# CALTROUT'S ACTION PLAN


In response, CalTrout vigorously opposed stocking since the planted trout would crowd out the trophy-quality fish that naturally spawn in the upper Sacramento River.

We also advocated for an interim fishing closure on the tributaries that were untouched by the poison and filled with juvenile wild rainbow trout. Working with Southern Pacific, CalTrout proposed a nine-point recovery plan to restore the fishery within three years. Though the plan was met with some local opposition, it proved to be successful. Thanks to these efforts, the Upper Sacramento is now a thriving state-designated Wild Trout fishery and blue-ribbon trout stream.

# TAILWATERS, KEEPING IT SIMPLE | OCTOBER 2021

Tailwaters, you love them, you hate them, you love to hate them or you hate to love them. They evoke more emotion than a mid 2000's emo band trilling about teen angst and heartbreak. While they can get a bad rap for being crowded and technical, they're always there for you. Tailwaters present an interesting niche in the fly fishing world and this post is here to help demisty them for you. As a full time San Juan River guide, I hope to share with you the thought process behind how and why I rig the way that I do. The San Juan is a tailwater so I guess you could say this is my life. If you hate tailwaters, then you're really going to hate this so now is the time to check out my piece on creeks here.

Tailwater a definition and clarification.

If you're newer to fly fishing a tailwater is simply water directly below a hydraulic structure, a la a dam. With this in mind there is a difference between a water below a dam and what most fly anglers would define a "tail water". Just because a river is below a dam doesn't mean it will fish like your angler definition of a tail water. When fly anglers talk about tail waters they are usually referring to fisheries with a large biomass of trout with high populations of midges. Tailwaters are almost synonymous with midge fishing as well as various mayflies species like baetis, pmds, and other food staples like scuds.




